2022 Preliminary Rules of Play (Page 1):

Format: Jim and Bill Flights (Men's):

Friday: Scramble (Holes 1-9), Best Ball (10—18)

Saturday: Scramble (Holes 1-9), Chapman (Holes 10—18)

Campbell Flight (Ladies):

Friday: Scramble (Holes 1-9), Shamble (Holes 10 –18)

Saturday: Scramble (Holes 1-9), Shamble (Holes 10 –18)

Skins: Optional Net Skins Game (within flight): \$100 per team

Format **Scramble:**

Details: Each player tees off and the best shot is selected. Both players hit from that spot, within one club-length (one putter-head length on the green), maintaining the integrity of the lie (i.e. ball in the rough stays in the rough) and repeat this procedure until the ball is holed.

Handicaps: Combined 35% A player, 15% B player, divided by 2 for 9 holes (rounded nearest tenth).

Best Ball:

Team's score will be determined by the "better net score" on each hole with a maximum of net triple bogey.

Handicaps: Players receive 85% of their course handicap.

Chapman:

Each player tees off. Players then switch and play their partner's ball for the second shot. After both players have hit the ball twice, the team selects the best ball and alternate until the ball is holed with a maximum score of net triple bogey. Any penalty strokes incurred **do not** affect the order of play.

Handicaps: Combined 60% A player, 40% B player, divided by 2 for 9 holes.

Shamble:

Each player tees off and the best shot is selected. Players select the best tee shot and play their own ball until the ball is holed. After the tee shot only, players may both play from within one club-length (one putter-head length on the green), maintaining the integrity of the lie (i.e. ball in the rough stays in the rough).

Handicaps: Players receive 80% of their course handicap.

**Handicap percentages above are based on USGA recommendations.*

Handicaps: The index revision on June 15, 2022 will be used.

Index Spread Provision: Players on a team with indexes differing by greater than 9.0 for the men's Jim and Bill flights and 12.0 for ladies' Campbell flight will result in the higher player's index being reduced to within that spread of the lower player's index prior to flighting, handicap calculations, allowances, formats, etc.

2022 Preliminary Rules of Play (Page 2):

Flights: Flights are determined by the teams' total handicap indexes (after index spread adjustment) in ascending (low to high) order for each flight. Strokes are allocated as they fall.

Tees: Men will be set to play the II tees (approx. 6500 yds.)
Note: The Men's Gross prize will be awarded to a II tee playing team
If a player's age and index combine to 70 or higher, they may play the III tees (6000 yds.)
Typically, a player's III tee handicap is 2-4 strokes lower than their II tee handicap
All Ladies will play the V tees (approx. 4800 yards)

Ties: A tie for Member Member Champions will be decided by a sudden-death playoff starting on #17, then #18. If still tied, #18 will be repeated until a winner is decided. Men will play a Chapman, while Ladies' will play a Shamble. Players will play the same tees (with any strokes) from the tournament proper. All Flight ties will be broken by Saturday/Round 2's round with the lowest 18-hole net score winning. If this results in a tie, then the last 9, last 6, etc. from Round 2 will be used.

Inclement Weather: Should inclement weather prohibit the finishing of all rounds, scoring will be completed based on 9 holes completed at a time. Flights will be determined by the most number of 9-holes all teams in the flight have completed.

This rule is added to help with pace of play and fun for all players:

“Gimme” Rule:

A putt may be considered a “gimme” if it is closer to the hole than the distance between the metal bottom of the flagstick and the edge of the black tape. To measure, the flagstick must be laid down with the metal bottom touching the edge of the hole and the entire ball must be within the white section of the flagstick. If any part of the ball would be touching the black tape or above, a gimme is not permitted. A ‘Gimme’ **counts as a stroke.**

Local Rules and Reminders:

- **Penalty Areas:** Marked with red paint. Players may proceed under the rules for a lost or unplayable ball using the last point of entry. If a ball is not found anywhere else on the course, it is considered lost in the general area or out of bounds and players may proceed under the stroke and distance penalty rule for lost ball.
- The 14 Club Rule is in effect.
- Relief from stance/swing on a **sprinkler head** may be given if the ball is in the general area (not bunker), the head is on or within two club-lengths of the ball and of the putting green, and must be on the intended line of play.
- Relief may be taken from **sod seams** only of any newly laid sod.
- For any rules questions that cannot immediately be decided, please play and hole 2 balls under Rule 3-3 and seek a Golf Professional after play.
